Guaranteed benefits:

- A **tax deduction** for remaining value of the rig.

- The eternal **gratitude** of the recipient's community.
- The **satisfaction** of extending the life of the rig.
- The **simplicity** and **speed** of disposal of the unwanted ambulance.

Optional benefits (if you choose):

- **Publicity** as a donor and the good will that brings in your community.
- Personal **participation** in hand-over ceremony.
- Establishment of **relationship** with the recipient.
- Annual update about the use of that ambulance and the **satisfaction** that comes from that knowledge.

We can only accept serviceable ambulances. For this reason, we evaluate each offered rig before accepting it into our program.

Once confirmed, you sign the title over to AG and we take it from there.

Our Applicants

Medical service providers, in under-served international communities, who lack adequate patient transport capabilities

Applicant responsibilities (before delivery):

- Get support from local Rotary club (we can help you reach out to local clubs).
- Complete application (available from AG website).
- Get approved by the coordinating organization (Project C.U.R.E. or AG Country Coordinator).

When a match is found by AG, you will be offered the specific ambulance.

You accept, if you wish, by paying the standard processing fee (per AG website) and agreeing to the responsibilities below.

Payment notes:

- This fee covers the average costs of delivery of the ambulance.
- Payment ensures that you have the financial ability to maintain and operate the donated ambulance.
- Payment can be made by another organization on your behalf.

Recipient responsibilities (after delivery):

- Send a letter of thanks to the donor.
- File an annual report (available from AG) describing the usage of that ambulance.
- File a final report (available from AG) when your organization ceases use of the ambulance
